Flyers Score For Youth Hockey

Tonight's Flyers Cup game is not the first time that the Flyers have done something for the youth hockey community of the Delaware Valley. The Flyers have been active for over a decade.

Beginning in January 1970 with the inaugural Flyers' Clinic at The Spectrum, the Flyers have been helping out wherever and whenever they could to help make hockey grow in the Philadelphia metropolitan area.

In came the sellout crowds and two Stanley Cups; Flyermania was sweeping the area. Boys and girls were throwing down their baseball bats and picking up hockey sticks. Area hockey leagues were expanding faster than ever—the sport was taking off.

Rinks began popping up, dotting the area. New clubs came to life, others merged. One thing that all these hockey clubs wanted was help from the Flyers.

And they got it. In September of 1976, the Flyers launched Hockey Central.

Formed to help youth hockey as the Flyers arm in the amateur hockey community, Hockey Central, with assistance from the Amateur Hockey Association of the United States began to move.

Hockey Central, now in its fourth year of operation, serves as a media dissemination and statistical gathering center. With their finger on the pulse of what's happening in the Atlantic Amateur Hockey Association, Hockey Central mails out newsletters to the teams regularly to help them see where they stand in their league.

Any youth hockey activities that the Flyers take on Hockey Central is involved with too.

Hockey Central also has helped in other areas. Generating news about high school hockey, fund raising, clinics for coaches and officials, all with the strong support of the Philadelphia Flyers.

In January of 1978, the first large-scale coaching clinic for hockey was held in the Philadelphia area. Over four hundred coaches from the area braved the snow, sleet and ice to listen to Pat Quinn, Fred Shero, Terry Crisp and others share their knowledge of hockey. The clinic, sponsored by the Flyers, Hockey Central and the Amateur Hockey Association of the United States, was called a success by all. In the words of Coach-in-Chief Walter Yaciuk, the clinic "cracked the ice" and helped kick off the AHAUS coaching certification program, that has been so successfully run locally by Jim Shute, one of Hockey Central's founding fathers, along with Aaron Siegel, Spectrum Vice-President, and Ken Gesner, President of the Atlantic Amateur Hockey Association.

In January 1979, the Flyers along with Hockey Central and AHAUS, ran a special coaching clinic designed to help the coach train the goaltender. The feeling said Shute, was "that the goalie receives the least amount of coaching and that something had to be done about it."

With this clinic, the Amateur Hockey Association of the United States began running a special goaltender training workshop series around the country.

Later in the year, the Flyers got even more involved. Youth Hockey Night was created; September 27 was the night. The champions from the area hockey leagues were saluted in pregame ceremonies. What's more, hockey clubs were given tickets to sell to help offset their cost, and it worked—the teams raised nearly six thousand dollars.

The Flyers and Hockey Central began a novelty fund-raising push with Flyers calendars and equipment bags being sold by the teams.

This past season the Flyers and Hockey Central kicked off the first Pepsi Shootout, featuring players from area teams at The Spectrum in a youth hockey version of NHL showdown, for telecast between periods of Flyer games.

And now in a new decade the Flyers have given their support again to youth hockey, this time with the Flyers Cup to symbolize scholastic hockey supremacy in the Delaware Valley, just as the Stanley Cup does in the National Hockey League.

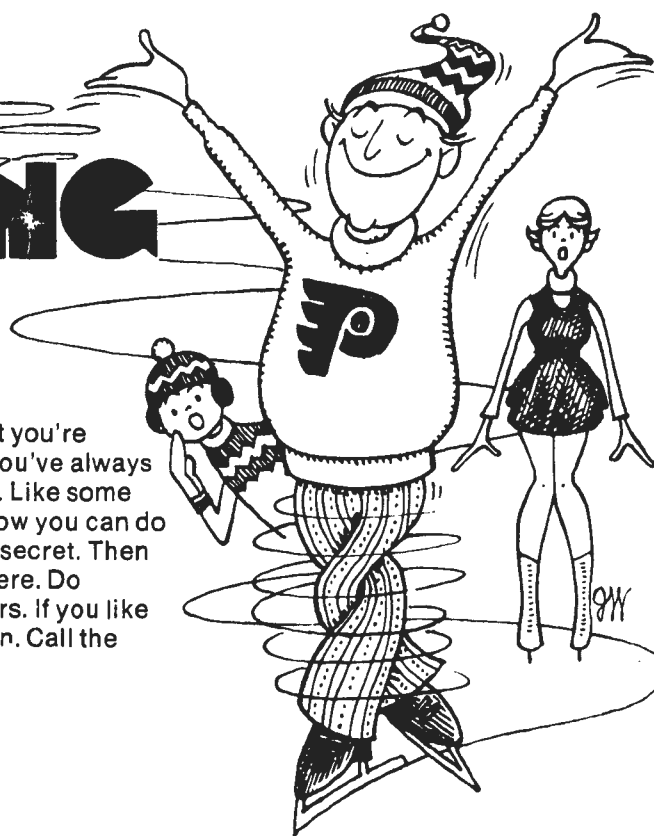
