Bruce Craig: "The Hockey Man"

Even with all the sponsorship and all the enthusiasm of the hundreds of children involved, Hockey Central is only as good as the instruction those kids are given on the ice. In that case, Hockey Central is very good.

Thirty-six-year-old Bruce Craig is in his second year as Hockey Central's head coach. His dedication to kids and hockey in that order is a prime reason why the organization continues to be successful. For a man who also coaches a college hockey team, that is no easy task. Craig's workload at Hockey Central is both heavy and crucial.

leaves that makes the system blossom and bear the sweet fruit of skilled young players. All the equipment in the world won't do anyone any good if there aren't eager, well-schooled bodies inside it.

Craig's commitment to Hockey Central is put into perspective when you take into consideration that he is also the head hockey coach at Villanova University. Between teaching five-year-olds how to skate and 20-year-olds how to run a power play, Craig's daylong shifts often begin at 5 a.m. He doesn't climb back over the boards and take a breather until 10 p.m.



"I'm responsible for all our on-ice programs," Craig explained. "I do our youth clinics, run practices, teach some hockey in classroom situations, instruct the psychology of the game, drills, everything."

Maybe that's the best way to explain Craig's role at Hockey Central: everything.

"It's so important to instruct these kids properly," he said. "We start them so young. We have learn-to-play clinics for kids from 5-to-9 years old in four different city rings. It's a good program. All they have to do is pay \$30 for their skates. We give them their equipment for free. At the end of their season they have an option to buy their equipment at a reduced rate."

If the corporate sponsorship and the equipment it provides is the root of Hockey Central, Craig's patient instruction is the network of branches and

"The main thing we stress with the hockey program at Villanova," he explained, "is grades. Basically, what we do is give a kid a chance to have some more fun playing the game of hockey. While he's at it, he's getting a top education. They have to provide all their equipment. We'll give them sticks, but that's it. We're a small Division III program. We'll get our players tutors, whatever it takes, but they have to realize they are here for an education. They're not going to the NHL.

"This is my first year at Villanova," Craig said. "I have some definite goals for the program. What I really want to do is qualify for the NCAA playoffs. Our schedule is a little weak right now, but we're close, real close. I don't think we'll get a bid to the playoffs this year, but we're in great shape to improve. We won 10 of our first 15 games this year and our leading scorer and our third-leading scorer

were both freshmen. One thing we are going to need next year is a goalie. I have a senior and a sophomore splitting time this year. I have to replace the senior. We have four or five local players but most of our players are from the New England area. Right now we have six or seven boys from the Detroit area talking to us, too."

Craig is right at home working on hockey rinks in the Northeast and the Main Line. After growing up in Toronto and Montreal, he graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1975. He played hockey at Penn and has coached various hockey clubs in the area since then.


"I have coached the Little Flyers and Germantown Academy," Craig said, "but when Hockey Central came around with this position, I took it. I jumped on it. I really love working with the little kids. The schedule isn't easy, I have a lot of long days, but most of the Hockey Central stuff is out of the way by Thanksgiving."

There is a common thread that runs through all Craig's coaching, from the kindergarteners to the marketing majors. It's called fun.

"That's my biggest thing," he revealed, "I want the kids to play with enthusiasm. You have to make it fun for them. I try to teach all the kids that the game is only 60 minutes long and out of that you may only play ten or 12 minutes. You have to make the most of it. You have to have fun and enjoy what you're doing. It's the same for the college kids. They are just little kids in big mens clothes. It's all the same."

Asking Craig which level of coaching he likes best is like asking a kid in a Baskin-Robbins what kind of cone he wants.

"I love 'em all," he said. "The 13-14-year-olds are the toughest. That's a tough age for anything. You just have to learn how to handle them. That's really all coaching is at any level, handling people correctly no matter what their personality or experience.






"Just the kids themselves are a vastly different group. The 13 and 14-year-old kids always think you're picking on them. That's a time in your life when your undergoing a lot of growth, physiologically and physically. It's a time of adjustment for them and you have to take that into consideration when you're working with them. The thing I try to do with that age group is make sure I'm on the ice doing the same thing they're doing. Sometimes they need a good kick in the ass, but, hey everybody does.

"The real little guys are cute, you know? But you have to start them off correctly, too. They all want attention and direction, the 5-year-olds and the college seniors. They want it for different reasons, but they're all important reasons. It's crucial that a coach understands that."

This one does.
