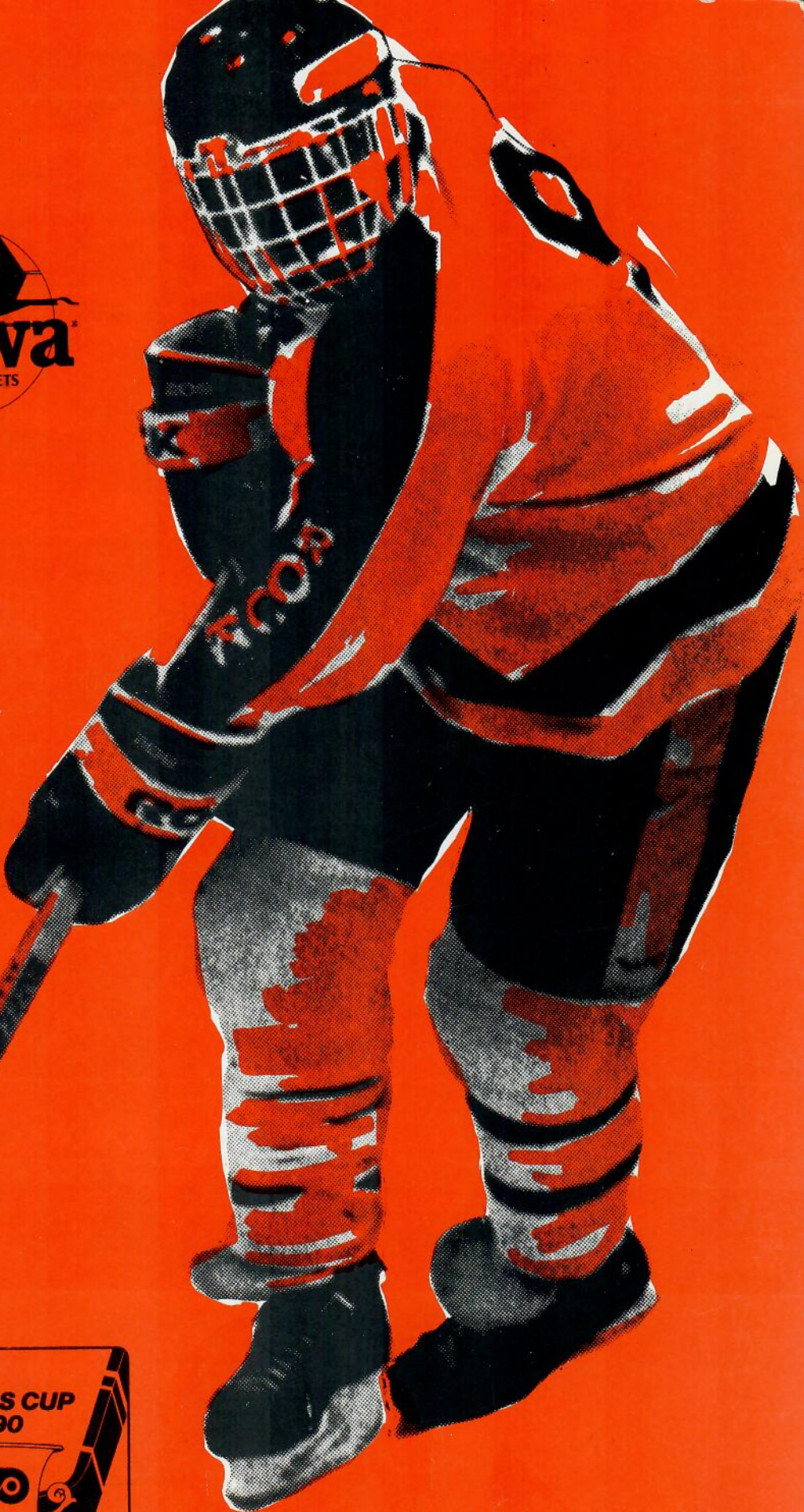
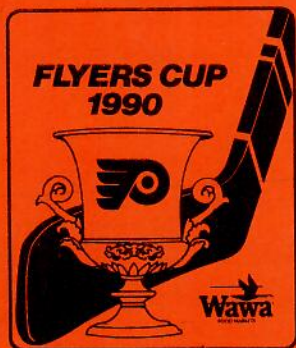

Dear High School Hockey Players:





IF YOU CAN'T MAKE IT, DON'T FRET. *JUST JOIN THE CLUB.*

As the new ice hockey coach at Villanova University, Pat Ferrill was eager to kick off the season last October, but there was first one small yet difficult task he had to undertake.

Ferrill had 45 players try out for the Wildcats, and he had to trim his roster to 23. That meant cutting 22 players, many of whom had come to Villanova thinking they had what it took to play Division III hockey.

"It was extremely difficult, that's for sure," Ferrill said. "But it's a coach's job to put the best team out there on the ice."

Some cuts were easy for Ferrill to make, but the most troubling were the players who hung on until the final cut.

"I guess we do hurt some feelings," he said. "We had some guys who really thought they could play, but the bottom line was that they just weren't good enough or there simply wasn't a role for them to fill. And I couldn't imagine it, but even at the college level you have parents call you up and ask why you cut their son."

If you play hockey in one of the four area high school leagues and feel you're one of the better players, Ferrill, along with some other local college coaches have some advice they'd like to share:

Don't choose a college for its hockey program, choose it for the education.

"Unfortunately, a lot of high school kids aspire to play Division I or Division III hockey, but many of them are misguided in thinking they can go and walk on or get a scholarship to these schools," La Salle University hockey coach Ed Austin said. "They've got to be realistic in their expectations."

Said Ferrill: "The most important thing is to pick a school for the academics, because you're going there for four years to get an education. Anything under Division I hockey, as I see it, is purely recreational hockey, and that goes even for Division III. You're not going to the NHL, so the education has to count."

There are, of course, exceptions to the rule a handful of area players have gone on to play Division I hockey and even make it to the NHL, though the fact remains that those players are few and far between.

But according to Ferrill and Austin, not having the talent to play division level hockey is no reason to throw your skates in the closet.

They say the viable alternative for those who want to continue their education and still play competitive hockey is to choose a school with a club program. Most college club teams are easier to make than a Division III school, and they provide just as much competition and fun.

Across the country, college club leagues have come to offer a level of play that pretty much borders on the NCAA's Division III talent level. And some of the best college club hockey can be found at schools right here in the Delaware Valley.

"There are a lot of kids who go away to a division school with the frame of mind that if you play division hockey, you're a somebody," West Chester University coach Bill Weil said. "We play Division III teams and even beat some of them. It's not necessarily a higher level of play." Austin, who is also president of the Delaware Valley Collegiate Hockey Conference (DVCHC), agrees.

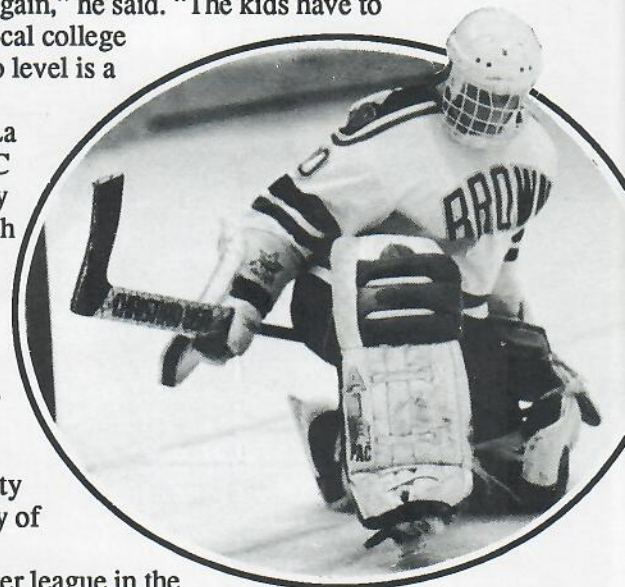
"I know a lot of kids who went off thinking they'll play Division I or III hockey, and I never hear about them again," he said. "The kids have to understand that local college hockey at the club level is a great option."

In addition to La Salle, the DVCHC includes Academy of the New Church College, East Stroudsburg University, Franklin & Marshall College, Kutztown University, St. Joseph's University and the University of Pennsylvania.

An even stronger league in the area is the Eastern Collegiate Hockey Association, which includes the U.S. Naval Academy, West Chester University, the University of Maryland, Lehigh University and a second team from the University of Pennsylvania.

This past month, of more than 200 college club teams in the nation, Penn State University was ranked fourth in the country, while Navy's team was ranked eighth and West Chester University was tenth.

More local colleges such as Bloomsburg University, Delaware County Community College,



Drexel University and the University of Delaware also compete in organized leagues.

One student who has played at both the division and club levels is West Chester University goalie Jim Rolston. After going to Conestoga and a prep school in New England, Rolston went on to play at the University of Rhode Island, at that time a Division III school.

He later transferred to West Chester University, where he found club hockey to be just as satisfying.

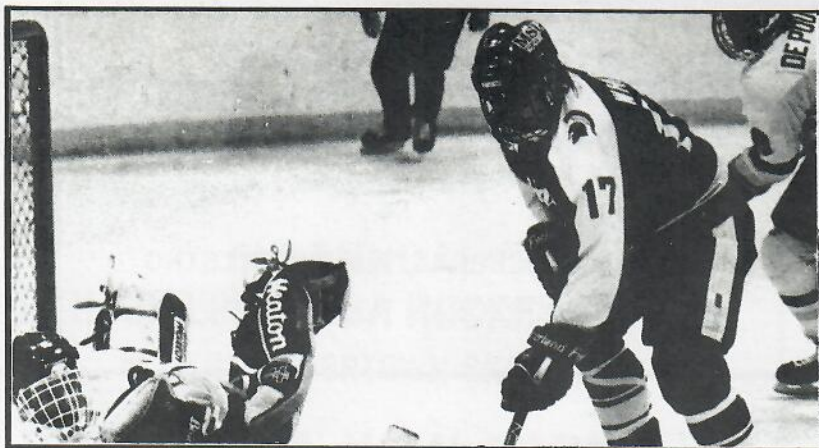
"The hockey program here is very respectable, a well-run and classy organization, and I've enjoyed every minute of it," Rolston said. "We have a lot of fun, and there's no pressure on you like at the division level. But we do work hard to be good."

This past year, the American Collegiate Hockey Association (ACHA), an organization that oversees college club hockey, separated the club leagues into two divisions based on strength. It also organized a national playoff for each of those divisions.

Although ice hockey at the club level appears to be growing stronger thanks to the ACHA, area coaches still stress that what is upmost important is getting a good education. Hockey, they said, should come second.

"The kids have to be realistic, and the parents have to be realistic also," said Nick Russo, an assistant coach at Villanova and a former assistant coach at West Chester University.

"You've got to say, 'Where can I go and get an education and still have some fun?' And you have to set your priorities. Should hockey be your first priority? No."

FLYERS CUP FLASHBACK:

In early 1979, some of the top executives with the Philadelphia Flyers organization sat down with representatives of the three area high school leagues and discussed ways to put scholastic hockey more in the spotlight.

"Our focus at the time was on the problem that the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) wouldn't recognize high school hockey," recalled Bob Butera, then president of the Flyers organization. "We asked ourselves what we could do to emphasize the kids playing hockey here, and what we decided was to establish our own championship."

The following year saw the first Flyers Cup Scholastic Championship, a tournament designed by the Flyers organization to give high school hockey in the Delaware Valley a well-needed boost.

In the tournament's program booklet that year, the Flyers organization explained that, "In a new decade, the Flyers have given their support again to youth hockey, this time with the Flyers Cup to symbolize scholastic hockey supremacy in the Delaware Valley, just as the Stanley Cup does in the National Hockey League."

The initial tournament proved to be a success and since that first drop of the puck in 1980, little has changed in what has become a prestigious title to vie for among high school teams in eastern Pennsylvania.

"We treated it as a major event, and all in all we tried to run it like a first rate tournament," Butera said. "There was tremendous enthusiasm for it and a lot of people doing a lot of volunteer work. It was an all-out cooperative effort."

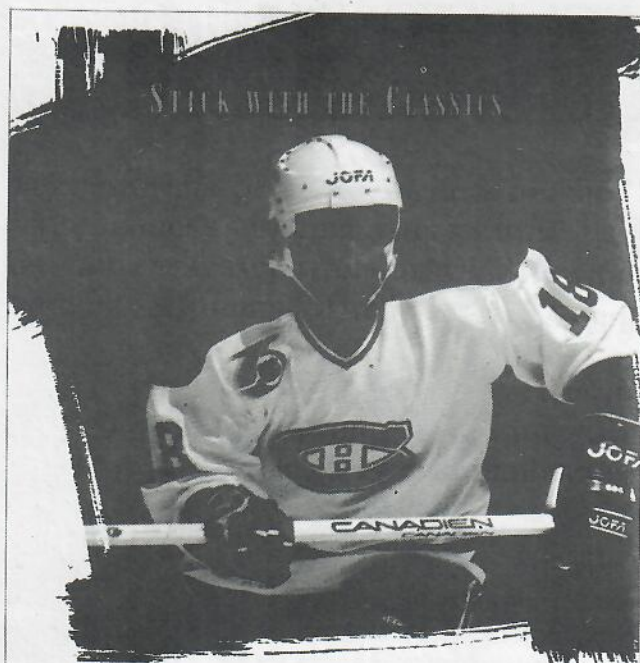

A.J. RUTH: NUMBERS ARE HIS GAME

Some people are greatly devoted to their hobbies, but anyone familiar with A.J. Ruth knows that his favorite pastime is somewhat of an obsession.

Numbers.

Specifically, hockey numbers.

Need to know the three Inter-County League players who scored goals just 6 seconds into a game?

Ever wonder which team in the league was held to not getting a single shot on goal?

How about the club that scored six short-handed goals in a period?

With a scratch of his head and a push of a few buttons on his IBM computer, A.J. Ruth would tell you it was Downingtown's Joel Allison, Conestoga's Rob Strawley, Radnor's Drew Talone, Methacton and West Chester East, respectively.

If you wanted, you'd also get the dates and the opponents. If you pushed him, maybe even the weather.

"Yep, got it right here," Ruth would say.

Since the mid-1970's, A.J. Ruth has been a regular in area ice rinks, one who is always willing to talk hockey.

Ruth, if you haven't found him yet, is the short, stocky man with the gray flattop and thick glasses, the West Chester University team jacket with the patches and exchange pins from around the world, the ever-present clipboard in hand. Come game time you can find him in the scoring box, doing what he loves most: keeping statistics.

"I simply enjoy it and I'm a statistician at heart," Ruth says. "I've always been intrigued by numbers, ever since high school."

Ruth takes his hobby very seriously.

Few high school leagues in the country if any are fortunate enough to receive the type of statistics Ruth provides on a weekly basis for the Inter-County Scholastic Hockey League and the Eastern High School Hockey League. And it should be noted that he provides these services on a volunteer basis.

Ruth delves far beyond the customary wins, losses and ties, and well past the leading

scorers and top goalkeepers.

With an A.J. Ruth stat-sheet, each of the 28 teams get some highly specialized statistics, ranging from the exceptional like shots percentage, power-play goals for and against, hat tricks and one-goal games to the rather unique like penalty shots and penalty shot goals, open net goals and playmakers. In all, he provides statistics in 33 categories.

"He's kind of the first person I've ever seen do that to such an extent," West Chester Henderson coach Bob Friday said. "He's got stuff for everything you'd ever want to know and everything you'd never want to know."

"But no question about it, they're thorough and complete, and to say that's nice to have would be an understatement."

West Chester East coach Nick Russo is one who knows first-hand the benefits of having Ruth around. As a former assistant coach at West Chester University, Russo said the statistics he supplied was a key ingredient to that team's success.

"There's nobody better at what they do," Russo said. "If there was anything you wanted to know stat-wise during a game, you didn't have to wait a minute for it. Many games were won for us because of A.J."

Being thorough with numbers is something Ruth can't seem to help.

When he was promoted to the position of cost analyst with Bell of Pennsylvania in 1966, he began working with nothing but statistics. As if that weren't enough, he spent his lunch breaks and other spare time on the company's computers compiling personal data.

To this day, Ruth can tell you the number of vacation days he had during his 39 years with the company, the sick days he took, and among a horde of other things, the number of pay raises he got. Always finding data to compile and analyze, he also punched in his utility bills, then began tracing his family genealogy and previous property owners back to the days of William Penn.

So when his son, Mark, began playing for Haverford High in the early 1970s, how couldn't Ruth welcome the team's request to keep its statistics?

What followed was the Inter-County League asking Ruth in 1976 to begin compiling statistics for its 36 teams. When some of those clubs broke off to form the Eastern League in 1981, he then had two leagues to take care of.

Retiring from Bell of Pennsylvania in 1985, one of the first things Ruth did was buy his own computer. And with more free time on his hands, he offered his help to other area hockey teams.

Currently, Ruth is in his sixth year serving as a statistician and assistant coach at West Chester University, and this year will be his seventh in compiling stats for the Flyers Cup championship.

This past season he also began providing statistics for the five-team Eastern Collegiate Hockey Association of which W.C.U. is a member, a league that is next year looking to expand.

And lately, there's been rumor that the other two high school hockey leagues the Lower Bucks County and Suburban also wouldn't mind Ruth's services in the future.

While the work may at times be taxing for the 68-year-old Ruth (he spends almost 20 hours a week compiling hockey statistics), over the years technology has made it a bit easier.

A nice addition to his 200-year-old log house in Pottstown was a top-of-the line FAX machine, purchased for him last October by the three leagues. Ruth no longer has to wait for scoresheets to come in the mail, nor does he have to worry about mailing his statistics out. Now, everything is conveniently done over the phone.

"Some scoresheets I wouldn't get for months," he said. "And that was really the most frustrating thing for me."

Ruth, whose wife Phyllis has happily put up with his various hobbies for 35 years, doesn't plan on stepping away from hockey in the near future. But when he does finally decide to call it quits, he's taken steps to assure that his work with the high school leagues won't be forgotten.

"I've got it all tied up in boxes in the cellar," he said. "Every game sheet, every stat sheet, everything from 1976 on, and even some stuff before that which was passed on to me."

"I'm thinking one day I'm going to want to quit, and I'll just say to someone, 'You take it. Here it is.' Really I enjoy it, though, and I think people appreciate it. So as long as my health is okay, and my wife's health is okay, I'm gonna keep doing it."
